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Paediatrics (under 16 years)

<p>Head</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Unexplained seizure(s)Unexplained chronic headache where significant pathology is suspected <p>Spine (after an x-ray has been performed)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Unexplained back pain where significant pathology is suspectedUnexplained neck or back pain with associated neurological signsSignificant trauma <p>Hip (after an x-ray has been performed)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Suspected septic arthritisSuspected slipped femoral capital epiphysisSuspected Perthes disease <p>Elbow (after an x-ray has been performed)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Suspected significant fracture or avulsion injury, that will change management	<p>Wrist (after an x-ray has been performed)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Suspected scaphoid fracture <p>Knee (no x-ray required)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Internal joint derangement
